- Total budget for 2014 2020 is €70,2B
- Remains the most open research programme in the world

The three H2020 pillars

1. Excellence in the Science Base

- European Research Council
- Marie Curie Actions
- Future and Emerging Technologies (FET)
- Research infrastructures (including e-infrastructures)

3. Tackling Societal Challenges

- Health, demographic change and wellbeing
- Food security, sustainable agriculture and forestry, marine and maritime and inland water research and the bioeconomy
- Secure, clean and efficient energy
- Smart, green and integrated transport
- Climate action, resource efficiency and raw materials
- Inclusive, innovative and secure societies

2. Creating Industrial Leadership

- ICT, nanotech, advanced materials, <u>biotechnology</u>, advanced manufacturing and processing, and Space
- Support innovation for SME

So, what's new?


- A single programme bringing together three separate programmes/initiatives*
- Coupling research to innovation from research to retail, all forms of innovation
- Focus on societal challenges facing EU society, e.g. health, clean energy and transport
- Simplified access, for all companies, universities, institutes in all EU countries and beyond

* The 7th Research Framework Programme (FP7), innovation aspects of Competitiveness and Innovation Framework Programme (CIP), EU contribution to the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT)

Simplification!

- Single set of simpler and more coherent participation rules
- New balance between trust and control
- Moving from several funding rates for different beneficiaries and activities to just two
- Replacing the four methods to calculate overhead or «indirect costs» with a single flat rate
- Major simplification under the forthcoming financial regulation
- Successful applicants to get working more quickly: time-to-grant of 8 months; exceptions for the ERC and in duly justified cases


COST Action

Anihwa's open call for prosals

- 1. Promoting research integrating animal health and welfare: development of animalbased indicators of animal health and welfare, development and implementation of new husbandry systems ensuring good health and welfare.
- 2. Development of knowledge which may lead to new or improved tools for diagnosis and disease prevention, including vaccines.
- 3. Improvement of preparedness for emerging and exotic diseases (including vectorborne diseases and zoonoses) by an epidemiological approach to risk pathways identification.
- 4. Antimicrobial and anthelmintic resistance, and development of alternative curative and preventive therapies.
- Norway
 - Supports only 1. and 2 of the above, and:
 - "Pre-proposals within the marine sector / fisheries are not invited, unless they represent basic research with relevance also for the agricultural sector."

The thematic H2020 calls

- First call 11. December 2013, thereafter every second year
- Drafts of the work programme have been circulated, and one topic might be of particular interest to this network:
 - SFS-10-2014/2015: Tackling disease related challenges and threats faced by European farmed aquatic animals:
 - Scientific basis and tools for preventing and mitigating parasitic diseases of European farmed fish (around €7M)
